A NEW CHAPTER BEGINS BY NATHAN ST. JEAN, ROCKY MORELLI, & GEORGE BARRETT

As Opportunity Networks begins a new chapter in a long history of supporting individuals with developmental disabilities I think there is some important information the people should know about the process and thoughts behind the renovation of our center located in Amherst.

In 2013, Opportunity Networks, Inc.'s dream came true when we were selected by Building On Hope as their signature project for 2014. You hear all the time about dreams coming true, but you never really believe it could happen to you or your agency. Being a small non-profit agency that works with individuals with disabilities there is not a lot of flexibility or latitude with funding and funding sources. For years our agency could only imagined what it would be like to have the resources to improve our facility at Caldwell Drive in Amherst and make it worthy of the individuals with disabilities we support daily. Building on Hope made our dream a reality and the individuals we support are benefiting thanks to their efforts of Building On Hope.

The initial renovations began on January 2, 2014 with the final "extreme make over phase taking place from May 9, 2014 – May 18, 2014. To say the transformation is incredible doesn't do justice to the work that was involved and the dedication, commitment and passion shown by the Building On Hope team.



The Opportunity Networks project involved the organization's 6,000 square feet of space at 11 Caldwell Drive in Amherst, which has been occupied by Opportunity Networks for more than 30 years. In that time, little more than basic updating and maintenance was performed. The building was in many regards falling down around the staff and individuals whom utilized the facility/center daily.

Funding this project was also a daunting task in its own right. Through a committed Board of Directors, Steering Committee and strong community support the task of raising money to help fund the project

kicked off during the summer of 2013. In addition, with generous support from Foundations such as the Norwin S. & Elizabeth N. Bean Foundation, Cogswell Benevolent Trust, the Kaley Foundation, Arthur L. Keyes Trust, Agnes Lindsay Trust, Fidelity Foundation, Walmart Foundation, Samuel P. Hunt Foundation, NH Charitable Foundation, Ann De Nicole Trust, The Barker Foundation, Gateways Community Services, and the Milford Rotary Club, Opportunity Networks was able to raise over \$400,000. The support didn't end there though. Building On Hope, through its extensive network of connections also provided over \$300,000 worth of in-kind support and materials.

For an all-volunteer group with no funding, Building on Hope relied solely on the goodwill and generosity of Granite State businesses helped make a dream become a reality. With that said, the renovation of Opportunity Networks was Building On Hopes largest endeavor to-date. Despite the daunting task, each week for approximately 8 months the Building On Hope team met to discuss the building process, and reminded everyone of how good our/the community truly is. Building On Hopes motto was 'Many Hands Make Light Work.' We only need a few more hands to complete this project and forever change the lives of some very special people." Those words say it all!!!

There were a total of 12 rooms that were renovated. The Rooms vary by purpose, from promoting healthy and independent living skills, employment and learning, to pursuit of interests, and general needs. Volunteers had the chance to aid the creation of a movement room, a tech theater, creative center, administrative offices, function and conference rooms, kitchen, cafeteria, and more. Through the support of Building On Hope our new Amherst center has ADA bathrooms for the individuals to use, wheelchair accessible kitchen for individuals to utilize while learning how to cook, a computer room for education and training purposes, a movement room

for recreational activities, dance, basketball and range of motion activities,

a multisensory theatre, arts and crafts room with a baking oven & pottery wheel, a sneolezen room designed for multi-sensory use for individuals

with autism and outside raised gardens for the individuals to utilize for gardening, tactile stimulation and incorporate into cooking classes.

With the support of Building on Hope, local businesses, donors, and volunteers handled the finishing touches, transforming it into a state-of-the-art facility that will improve the lives of people with all disabilities for years to come.

The renovation will now allow us to provide expanded hours to further support families, provide after hour programming/high school transition services, multisensory learning, and communication technologies. Now with a new center, Opportunity Networks is better positioned to meet the emerging challenges and needs of individuals with developmental disabilities for many years to come. Again, this would never have happened without the support and partnership with Building On Hope.

For those of you who/whom have not had the opportunity to come and see our new center, I encourage you to come and visit.
