1.)The Gift Of Lights New Hampshire Motor Speedway

The event opens for the season on Thursday

November 23, 2023 and goes through December 31, 2023. This is the 13th season and there are more than 3.5 million "twinkly" lights to be seen throughout the ride around the speedway.



There is a tunnel of lights including the 12 Days of Christmas and more.

2.) Charmingfare Farm

Santa's Christmas at Charmingfare Farm. Get on a horse drawn wagon and enjoy a wagon ride around the farm. Along the way you will see beautiful light displays, and listen to sleigh bells. Dress warm and bring a blanket! There are 12 holiday scenes, a real animal nativity and the North Pole. Santa will be



available at the Reindeer Barn for everyone to visit and drop off letters.

There is also a campfire where

you can purchase s'mores kits and get warm around the fire.

3.) Labelle Lights

Labelle Lights at Labelle Winery is in Derry, NH. The lights are located on a golf course. They have numerous theme weeks throughout the months of November and December including, ugly sweater week, santa costume week, frozen costume week, holiday pajama week and more. They also have a toy drive and snack drive where guests can donate either or to help those in need. LaBelle Lights are open starting November 14th till January 7th. They are open Tuesday-Sunday from 4:30-9:30pm.



4.) Santa's Village

Santa's Village is located in Jefferson, New Hampshire. Santa's Village is open Saturday and Sundays starting November 11th to December 23rd. It costs \$52 per person to enter the event. They also offer a train ride through the snowy woods. Make sure you dress in your

best outfit to take a picture with Santa!



5.) Bright Nights at Forest Park

Bright Nights at Forest Park is located in Springfield, Massachusetts. This show is put on by Springfield Parks and Recreation Department. They have been happening since 1995 and have had over 67 million visitors. This event will be going on from November 22nd, to January 1st. It will cost 24\$ per car and is a drive through event.

6.) Lightfest



7.) Zoolights



Tips and Tricks

- Ensure your gas tank is always at least half full. Because in case you get stuck you'll be able to keep warm.
- Make sure you keep an Emergency Kit in your car including Blankets, Candles, First Aid and shovel.
- Dress in appropriate clothing including multiple layers Hat,gloves and scarf as well as access to face protection.
- Drive at appropriate speeds for the weather conditions.
- Keep Pathways and driveway clear of Snow/Sleet as soon as possible. Because as time goes on it will solidify if let be.
- Be Careful of Ice/Black ice walk with small controlled steps while maintaining your balance.
- Your local Public works department/ Transfer Station will often have Sand/Salt for Free.
- Make sure all your devices are charged in case of a Power Outage.

Ice Skating at Conway Arena is a wonderful activity for everyone, despite your disabilities. The program is a wonderful way to connect with friends and the community, while also working on gaining new skills and independence on the ice.



Before I started going ice skating, I was scared at the thought of trying since I have never been before. When I first got on the ice, I was not very good. It was hard to keep my balance and I was afraid of falling. Luckily, the staff at Conway Arena were extremely positive and helpful. My first day ice skating, Chrissy (one of the staff) helped me get on the ice. At first I was nervous, but she

was patient and got one of the skate helpers for me to use. After helping me make my way onto the ice, Chrissy stayed with me the whole time to help me work on my footing and getting comfortable on the ice.

I'm not the only one who needed help when they first started. I talked with my friend, Bhaba, and he said that when he started skating he "needed extra help" and was "nowhere near as good as he is now". Before, Bhaba also needed assistance on the ice and after five years of skating he is basically a pro! He told me that ice skating helped him learn new skills, and thanks to it, he is now able to



skate independently and play hockey. He is very proud of his increased skating abilities and new skills and so are the staff.

I talked with Chrissy to hear more about the program from her perspective. Chrissy has been one of the staff at ice skating for awhile and has been helpful and teaching others how to be more comfortable on the ice. She loves seeing the progression of clients skills develop on the ice and even told me about one of her favorite memories working with us. She told me about how a client had issues walking and the joy she felt when they continued to develop their skills and was able to skate from one side of the arena to the other without any help from staff or skate helpers.

While I have ordered many different things, today I am reviewing their "Hail Caesar" wrap. I chose to have it with a spinach wrap but there were many to choose from. The chicken tasted nice and crispy. The lettuce seemed fresh and crunchy. I really liked the dressing they put on it. The wrap was so big I chose to save half of it for later! I would give this wrap a 5 out of 5 stars!



Jamie's Culinary Corner: Lasagna Cupcakes By: Jamie

Love lasagna but hate the time and effort involved? Well we at Opportunity Networks have a great hack for you, Lasagna Cupcakes! By replacing the noodles with wontons you get great serving size Lasagna with all the flavor but none of the hassle!



Ingredients:

- Cooking spray
- 1 lb of ground beef (93%) or any ground protein you would like
- 1 tsp oregano
- 2 tsp dried onion flakes
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Package wonton wrappers (not egg roll wrappers)
- 2 cups grated parmesan cheese
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup ricotta
- 2 tsp dried parsley
- 1 cup pasta sauce (we liked Rao's marinara)
- ¼ cup chopped fresh basil leaves as a garnish



Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Prepare muffin cups with cooking spray.
- Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add your ground beef (or subbed protein) with the oregano, dried onion flakes and salt and pepper. Cook until brown and crumbly.
- 3. Meanwhile prepare your cheese mixture in a mixing bowl with the parmesan, mozzarella, ri-

cotta and parsley. We found using our hands was a good method to ensure all the cheeses mixed together.

 Next place wonton wrappers into each of the muffin cups so that they are flush with the bottom and the sides.



5. Scoop and flatten a small amount of the cheese mixture on top of the wontons, followed by the beef then pasta sauce. This will be topped with another wonton (we suggest cutting the edges off these wontons as we dont want them to stick up above the muffin cups, this will lead to them


becoming hard in the oven). Depending on the size of your muffin cups you can do anywhere from 1-2 of these layers. Finish with a Wonton on the top covered with more of the cheese mixture.



6. Bake in the oven until the edges of the cupcakes are browned, 18-20 minutes. Let rest in tins for 5

-10 minutes before running a knife around them to loosen and remove. Garnish with fresh basil to serve.


